Dear Friends

It is an honor to represent Maine in the United States Senate, and I welcome this opportunity to share several key accomplishments for our state from the previous year.

As Vice Chair of the Appropriations Committee, I have secured nearly \$580 million for 230 projects across all of Maine's 16 counties to promote job creation, workforce training, and economic development; expand access to health care; support law enforcement; improve public education and infrastructure; and protect our environment. As the new Congress begins, I am honored to be taking the helm of the Committee, the first Mainer to do so in nearly a century, and I remain committed to ensuring that federal spending produces real results for our state and nation.

Maine has the oldest average age in the country, which is why I have long prioritized health-focused legislative efforts. There were more than 1,860 health care bills introduced during the 118th Congress. Only 15 health care bills were signed into law, and I was a lead sponsor of five of them. These bills will enhance care for individuals with Alzheimer's, autism, and substance abuse issues through improved research funding, strengthened public health programs, and increased support for rural first responders.

Another important bill that I coauthored was the Social Security Fairness Act. Since 2003, when I led the first-ever Senate hearing on the Windfall Elimination Provision and the Government Pension Offset, I have sought to end these provisions of the Social Security Act that unfairly reduce the Social Security benefits that public employees or their spouses have earned. I am pleased to say that with the passage of my bill, the Social Security Fairness Act, in December, public sector retirees will now receive the full Social Security benefits they have earned.

When the Maine way of life was under threat, I was certain to defend the interests of our state. I worked to protect Maine's potato farmers when the Department of Agriculture tried to reclassify the potato from a vegetable to a grain. I thwarted efforts to consolidate USPS mail operations at the Hampden postal facility, which would have disrupted mail delivery throughout our state. I sounded the alarm with leaders at the FBI and Departments of State and Treasury on the spate of illicit marijuana growing operations that are destroying properties and providing refuge to foreign criminals in our state. Following damage to our working waterfronts after last winter's storms, I secured \$15 million to help fishing communities recover. I championed funding to support the Maine Air National Guard base, Bath Iron Works, and Portsmouth Naval Shipyard.

As of last December, I have cast more than 9,100 consecutive votes, continuing my record of never missing a roll-call vote since my Senate service began in 1997. My ranking as the most bipartisan Senator reflects Maine's tradition of working with a spirit of cooperation and respect.

The Kennebec County Sheriff's Office is pleased to make the following report regarding the services we provided to the people of Kennebec County in 2024. These services include the Law Enforcement Division, Corrections Services, Civil Process, Court and Transport Division. We provided many regional assets to our communities including a K-9 Teams, Dive Team, Sex Offender Registry, Veterans Advocacy and Accident Reconstruction.

In 2024, Law Enforcement Deputies logged thousands of calls for service. Our call service area widened a bit covering calls for service in the City of Hallowell as there staffing levels at that agency are very low.

One type of call has fortunately decreased: overdoses of prescribed medications or illicit substances. I personally believe the increase in treatment options, both locally and nationally, has had an impact on overdose deaths. This Sheriff's Office will always support our citizens with substance dependency disorders by providing avenues that can assist with their recovery.

In 2021 a shift in the balance of call taking we had shared with the Maine State Police required my office to expand the Law Enforcement Division by two Deputies. In 2022,2023 and 2024 a new deputy position was added to my roster to bolster staffing needs to provide increased calls for service.

On December 30, 2024, I appointed Chris Read as my Chief Deputy. He has over three decades of experience in law enforcement and is a highly respected member of our team. His appointment to this position assures the highest service available to Kennebec County Residents.

In 2024 our patrol division welcomed Alex Morin, Zack Reynolds, Hunter McCaslin and parttime deputy Garth Coleman to our team. Two of the four mentioned individuals are fully certified LEO's.

In 2024 the Sheriff's Office began School Resource Officer duties for MSAD #11 in Gardiner. The salary and the benefits for the deputy are paid in full by MSAD #11. This is the 3rd SRO position held by a Kennebec County Deputy Sheriff. The other two are MSAD #49 and RSU#38.

My agency continues to receive federal funds to conduct patrol details county wide. To date, the effort of Kennebec County Deputies in those federally funded programs excel statistically for

the number of interdictions for drug related criminal activities. These details are not limited to motor vehicle stops. We have been conducting watercraft details on several different bodies of water here in Kennebec. We have been using our UTV (provided through a federal grant) driving from Augusta to Hallowell and through Farmingdale and into Gardiner on the Rail Trail.

Our Civil Process Deputies serve legal documents on behalf of attorneys, the courts, citizens, local, and state government, landlords and other entities. In 2024, the three civil deputies received over 4,500 requests for service in Kennebec County. This is a decrease from 2023. Some of the services include civil summons & complaints, foreclosures, evictions, small claims, child support notices from the State and enforcement of court orders and writs to name a few.

During the past year, our Correctional Facility managed 2600 inmate intakes. The offenses committed by defendants included everything from Trespass to Homicide. Substance abuse and the proper treatment of citizens with mental illness continue to be two primary concerns at the Correctional Facility.

Inmates at the Kennebec County Correctional Facility are asked to work and earn time off their sentences if applicable. Inmates who are a risk to the community work inside the facility cleaning and cooking, while others are supervised on outside projects. One may think that this only benefits the County, or our local municipalities, but it does not. It also benefits the inmate population as well. They are very hard workers, and they make a difference.

We are committed to providing innovative programs to reduce crimes, assist victims, and to provide enhanced public safety. We acknowledge the ever-growing opiate addiction problem nationwide and have committed to partnerships at the Federal, State and Local levels to combat this problem. Our approach is aggressive enforcement, education, treatment and recovery for those afflicted with this horrible addiction.

I would like to thank all my administrative staff who support the patrol division, detective division, correctional division and the civil deputies. The amount of paperwork that is handled by these individuals is staggering and their work is greatly appreciated. Job well done by all.

As your Sheriff, and moving forward into 2025, my focus will remain constant, serving the people of this county and our visitors honorably, professionally through good common sense and good judgement.

Report of the Selectmen 2024

2024 was a year of challenges for your Board of Selectmen. Here is a synopsis:

- We contracted with Parker Appraisal Services to do a long-overdue, town-wide property reassessment. It did not go as well as we had hoped. While this company came with good recommendations, we were not pleased with the way they handled the property inspections. The appeal process was challenging and difficult. Yet we persisted and completed the task as required. All in all, the whole process was difficult and we learned some things along the way.
- We worked hard to NOT increase the town budget, yet a few small increases were approved from the floor at Town Meeting. Then the Kennebec County Tax Assessment came in much higher than any of our towns expected. Still we were able to drop the mil rate by more than half.
- We entered into greater collaboration with 30-Mile River Watershed Association to secure and manage a number of grants to tackle long-overdue repairs and replacements of culverts particularly on Trask Road, Jesse Ladd Road, Kimball Pond Road, and Tower Road. We first secured a grant to complete the engineering work on these locations to better meet the needs resulting from increasingly damaging storms. The work is huge.
- We continue to move toward implementation of the town-owned fiber optic internet network known as Vienna Boardband. Construction has been slowed due to a lack of response from Consolidated Communications (the owners of Fidium). "Make-ready" of poles is required in order for the town to attach our lines. CMP completed much of its work. We are still waiting for Consolidated to complete theirs. Needless to say, it's been a frustrating process.

A reminder that the Board of Selectmen meet every Tuesday (except when there is a 5^{th} Tuesday in a month). We begin at 6:30 p.m. The 1^{st} and 3^{rd} Tuesdays begin with warrants (a.k.a. bills are approved for payment). The 2^{nd} and 4^{th} Tuesdays are work sessions. The public with welcome. It continues to be our privilege to serve our community.

There were 11 fire-specific calls this year, two of which occurred in Vienna.

We were thrilled to celebrate the Vienna Fire Department's 50th Anniversary this year. Thanks to all who joined us on October 5th to celebrate such an incredible milestone. Additionally, we were able to raise over \$12,000 to help us purchase critical gear and equipment to keep all of our firefighters safe on calls. We cannot begin to express our gratitude for your continued support. We are proud to be an active part of this community.

Mount Vernon Rescue 2024

I would like to begin this year's report with acknowledging the retirement of Leslie Grenier this past August. Leslie has been a pillar member of rescue for 41 years. During many of those years, she served as Assistant Director. Leslie has dedicated herself to serving the communities of Mt. Vernon and Vienna regardless of the day, time, weather, or holiday. Leslie served as the primary responder during the daytime shift for many years and was often the only member in town during the day. She even managed to do this while working at Mt. Vernon Elementary School. Leslie has mentored new members as they joined rescue and often took time to help new members discuss and process calls. I would like to offer my sincere gratitude and appreciation for all that she has done to make Mt. Vernon Rescue the high quality first responder unit that it is today. If you see her around, make sure to congratulate her on her retirement. We hope she finds many adventures to fill her days.

Rescue responded to 225 emergency calls during 2024. 43 of these occurred in Vienna, (48 in 2023). Calls by month follows:

23 of our calls occurred during the daytime shift (6AM-6PM) and 20 during the nighttime shift (6PM-6AM).

We provided treatment for 35 patients, 19 were transported by NorthStar ambulance to Franklin Memorial Hospital, 5 were transported to MaineGeneral Medical Center. 9 Patients were not transported and for 1 we were canceled en route. There were 8 with no patient contact.

Our current active membership of rescue is four. Dr. Rachel Criswell meets with us throughout the year and serves as our Medical Director. This allows us time to discuss calls and troubleshoot any questions we have. These trainings allow us to keep up to date on changes in protocols and help us get a better understanding of how to treat patients in the field while we always ALS medical care.

As with the years in the past, Vienna firefighters respond along with us to rescue calls to help mark scenes and provide extra manpower when needed. Laura Church, the Fire Department Chaplain, also responds to most calls. Their assistance has proven to be invaluable. In a time where our membership is low, it is comforting to know that they are there to support us in any way we need them.

We continue to have an open door for anyone who may be interested in learning more about rescue and have considered joining our group. Please reach out to us with any questions and we are more than happy to meet with you to talk about questions or help you get enrolled in a class. We have been working with Delta in Waterville to help people with signing up for the course and offer help with the content.

I would like to thank all the Vienna citizens for your support of rescue. Your gratitude at call, your notes of thanks and your support at town meetings are appreciated.

2024 PLANNING BOARD REPORT

In 2024 the Planning Board issued sixteen permits with a total construction cost estimate of \$1,729,200. This was down from twenty-four permits in 2023. Four of the new permits were for activities within the Shoreland Zone. Six permits were issued for new residences, two for camps or bunkhouses, one for a garage, two for sheds, four for decks and steps, and one for a solar power unit. No subdivisions were approved.

The Planning Board administers the <u>Subdivision Ordinance</u>, the <u>Shoreland Zoning Ordinance</u>, the <u>Notification of Construction Ordinance</u>, the <u>Wireless Telecommunications Facilities Siting Ordinance</u>, and the <u>Floodplain Management Ordinance</u>. Additionally, Consolidated Communications and Central Maine Power Company require Planning Board, or other town official, approval for any new service connections. Although the town no longer requires Timber Harvest permits, harvesters must obey the state rules, and harvesting within the Shoreland Zone may require a permit under that ordinance.

Planning Board members are Tim Bickford, Creston Gaither, Ed Lawless, Waine Whittier, and Alan Williams and alternate member Stephen Trehu. We could use one more alternate member. The Board meets the fourth Wednesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. in the Town House.

Road Commissioner's Report

This year we have been able to accomplish some much-needed work due to the fact that there were fewer storms than prior years (hopefully the winter and spring storms will be minimal in the coming year).

Work Done in 2024

- 1) Whittier Hill/Tower Road required ditching and paving along with Egypt Pond for a total of 9,700 feet of pavement.
- 2) Thanksgiving storm with high winds and rain caused more damage to the Tower and Egypt Pond roads with blow downs and washouts.
- 3) Kept roads open and passable as storms arose by grading and hauling in fill and removing debris.
- 4) Mountain Road is a very lengthy job entailing much needed ditching, culvert replacement and debris removal.
- 5) Summer storms left us with washouts and down trees. Hauled in material wherever needed. Kimball Pond & Klir Beck roads required culvert replacements.
- 6) Graded all dirt roads in town.
- 7) All roads in town had washouts but there were some that had more storm damage (listed above) than others.
- 8) Cold patch on various roads with pot holes.

My Goals in 2025

- 1) Keep roads open and passable when storms arise
- 2) Install larger culverts as needed
- 3) Continue ditching efforts where needed
- 4) Grading and graveling all dirt roads to keep their integrity
- 5) Completion of Mountain road ditching project.

I would like to say thank you to the Vienna Fire Department, Troy Bean & Crew for helping to keep our roads open and cleared, Josh Markham for coming to our rescue when we needed his assistance, and to my community members for your phone calls and assistance.

Vienna Broadband Submitted by Jim Anderberg

Thank you for your patience and continued support as we work to bring Vienna's municipally owned fiber-to-the-home broadband network to every resident in our town. We know the delays in the make-ready process with CMP and Consolidated Communications have been frustrating, and we deeply appreciate your understanding as we navigate these challenges. However, we are encouraged by the progress being made. If you've driven through town recently, you've likely noticed the tall new power poles that have been installed—these are a critical step forward, as they make it possible to add our fiber infrastructure to the poles. Additionally, the construction of the central office near the Fire Department is well underway, and materials are on hand and ready for deployment once the utility work is complete.

This network is more than just an infrastructure project; it's a critical step toward ensuring reliable, high-speed internet for *all* of Vienna's residents—not just a select few. Unlike the large national provider Consolidated Communications (AKA Fidium), who has chosen not to offer service to every household in town, Vienna's municipal broadband network is committed to universal access. By subscribing to Vienna's locally controlled network, you are supporting a system that puts the needs of our entire community first. In contrast, choosing Fidium could jeopardize the success of our municipal network and risk leaving some of our neighbors without affordable broadband options.

This past year has been successful for the Kennebec Land Trust (KLT). With generous support from community members, we have worked to conserve important lands; provide public access for hiking, paddling, skiing, blueberry picking, and hunting; and promote land stewardship, conservation education, and partnerships.

KLT has an impressive list of accomplishments:7,800 acres under permanent conservation throughout our 413,000-acre service area; 58 miles of trails to explore; over 20 miles of conserved shoreline; and 1,100 household and business partner members.

As the owner of the McGurdy Stream Preserve, Peter Miller Woodland, Storer Farm Community Preserve and Vienna Woods Conservation Area, KLT contributes to Vienna's local tax base through the open space tax program. KLT holds conservation easements on the Flying Pond Farm and Whittier Shoreland.

As we look to the future, we will continue to conserve high value land and protect important wildlife habitat, and we're also offering programs to promote and expand conservation in ways that better serve our communities.

KLT also offers a great selection of outings and educational programs for the public, and we collaborate with schools and other organizations to engage youth and share our conservation message with the community. In March of 2024, KLT Executive Director Theresa Kerchner presented an overview of KLT's conservation programs to members of Mill Stream Grange #574. Theresa enjoyed learning more about this long-standing community organization!

Dr. Shaw Memorial Library Annual Report for the Town of Vienna 2023

As the new year rolls around, I am again reminded how grateful I am to live in this wonderful community of patrons and friends. The library is a special place where people come not only to browse our book collections and other materials such as magazines, cookware, or the wonderful Maine art that adorns every empty wall space. It is always a joy to hear children being read to, or little ones looking at books on their own, playing with toys or creating art.

The library has become a meeting place for many. There might be a training for Neighbors Driving Neighbors, a rendezvous with friends, or a regular town committee. We find our meeting room space used a great deal besides the frequent programming held there. Last summer we had several author visits as well as weekly activities for kids along with a bimonthly knitting group. Game Day was another popular bimonthly event held last winter which is resuming soon.

Once again, another goal was reached due to remaining funds in Barbara Kennedy's generous bequest. We paved the small area directly outside the back door that looks out over the field. The area beyond it was turning into a grassy spot, now so much nicer for the picnic table and Adirondack chairs that provide a lovely sitting place during sunny days.

Subscriptions to Hoopla, the Maine State Library Download Program, Comics Plus, and free passes to the Coastal Maine Botanical Gardens remain very popular. Another very popular offering is our free weekly Drop-in Tech Help Wednesday mornings from 9-12. We are able to provide this thanks to a grant through Grow Smart Maine. There aren't many, if any, tech questions Remi can't help with. Please come by if you need assistance with any devices!

Sixty-three new patrons joined the library during 2024. 26 % of these were from Vienna. As our towns continue to grow, we are delighted to welcome new people. We would like to know your needs, whether it is a book or library material you would like us to purchase or get for you on interlibrary loan, suggest or help with a program, or a resource you would like help accessing. Our purpose is to serve you.

Watershed Impact in 2024:

Water Quality Monitoring

With the help of 35 volunteers, our staff monitored 13 lakes and ponds (including Flying, Kimball, Parker and Whittier), making 112 visits. For more info, visit: https://3omileriver.org/water-qualitymonitoring/

In response to algal blooms on Androscoggin, we completed a 3rd season of intensified monitoring of the lake and its tributaries. We are now implementing next steps to help improve the lake's water quality.

Funding for Vienna Culverts

30 Mile wrote two successful grant proposals for the Town to address key road crossings on town roads that have repeatedly been suffering from severe washouts and road failures, and are a significant threat to water quality in downstream lakes. The first grant was \$49,875 from the Maine Infrastructure Adaptation Fund (MIAF) through Maine DOT. Funds are being used to hire an engineer to complete the scoping, design, and required environmental permitting necessary to upgrade three stream crossings on Jesse Ladd Road, Kimball Pond Road, and Trask Road in Vienna.

The second was the town's first-ever Climate Action Grant through Maine's Community Resilience Partnership. This \$50,000 grant will fund an engineered design at a fourth high-priority culvert crossing on Tower Rd, project management and grant writing, and cash match required to apply for additional funding to support the construction of these costly culvert upgrades.

Parker Pond Watershed Protection Project, Phase III

30 Mile was awarded \$60,633 in federal Clean Water Act* grant funding over two years to protect Parker Pond's water quality. The goal of this project is to reduce erosion and phosphorus loading to the lake in order to prevent algal blooms. Funding will largely support construction costs for improvements on town roads, private roads and other property throughout the watershed.

*Funding for this project, in part, is provided by the U.S.

Environmental Protection Agency under Section 319 of the Clean Water Act. The funding is administered by the Maine Department of Environmental Protection in partnership with the EPA.

First Line of Defense

Our paid staff and 49 volunteer Courtesy Boat Inspectors (CBIs) conducted 3,801 inspections in 2024. A variable-leaf milfoil plant fragment was found and removed from an entering boat by an Echo Lake volunteer CBI, saving the lake from a potential infestation.

Managing Invasive Plants

In August 2023, the invasive plant, swollen bladderwort, was discovered to be well-established in Tilton Pond in Fayette, upstream of Parker. Our 2024 efforts included installing a fragment net at the pond's outlet to reduce risk to downstream waters, increasing surveying on David Pond, monitoring plant growth, and supporting volunteer survey and removal efforts.

Since 2020, we've fought the infestation of invasive variable milfoil in Androscoggin Lake. We successfully removed all plants found in 2024, have kept milfoil from spreading and are seeing fewer plants overall. We'll continue the fight in 2025 to protect Androscoggin and all our lakes.

LakeSmart

30 Mile is a regional LakeSmart "HUB" support center for this statewide program. LakeSmart would not be possible without our partner lake associations – including Flying Pond and Parker Pond – and the 14 volunteer coordinators and evaluators doing the fieldwork. In 2024, 14 LakeSmart evaluations were completed in the 30 Mile region, delivering landowner education property-by-property and shore-by-shore to create a conservation ethic across the lake community.

Supporting Landowners

We launched a new initiative to improve shoreline buffers, planting over 300 live stakes on shorefront properties throughout the watershed.

Community Education

In 2024, we hosted several training and workshop opportunities for Courtesy Boat Inspector and Invasive Plant Patrol volunteers. Through our monthly e-newsletter and social media pages, we inform and educate the public about lake protection and promote opportunities for community involvement.

New Location in Mt. Vernon

Phase I of our building renovation is nearing completion and we will be moving our operation to Mt. Vernon Village in early 2025! We're excited to create a space for the community to work together to protect our lakes and ponds.

2 people complained of dogs coming after them aggressively

Spring is fast approaching. As a reminder, pull your bird feeders early if you have had bear issues in the past.

Please keep your dogs on a leash when walking them and hooked/penned when you cannot keep a constant eye on them. Your help would be appreciated by your neighbors and friends. Livestock, ducks and chickens are required to be under your control and not allowed in the public right of way as this causes a public hazard. These are a few reminders to help pets and livestock to stay safe.

It is that time of year again to license your dogs. The town clerk tries to call dog owners to remind them before February 1 to come in and register their dogs before the penalty starts. If you have discontinued your land-line phone number or changed your number, please call the Town Clerk to update your new phone number with her. For new residents, if your dogs are registered in your previous town, you need to update and transfer the dog registration to our town. By registering your dogs in Vienna, we will know who to return the dogs to. It is less stress on your pet and it will not cost you as much as when you go to the pound to retrieve your pet. The cost to register your dog is \$6 for altered dogs and \$11 for un-altered dogs. State mandated late fees of \$25 start February 1.

Report on the state of Mount Blue School District

At the close of 2024, the Mount Blue Regional School District is performing well. Our growing district has effectively used emergency funding from the past few years to shore up many physical needs and provide improved support to our children and communities. Hiring has been more robust this year, leaving many fewer open positions throughout the school system.

Cape Cod Hill Community School continues to attract statewide attention for its implementation of expanded community and student services. This is helping to address lingering impacts from the pandemic such as truancy, lower test scores and poor social behavior. Septic issues at our school will require significant work when weather conditions permit.

A water leak from the sprinkler fire suppression system at the middle school gymnasium resulted in total damage to the gym floor, bleachers and rooms beneath the gym. This was covered by insurance and restoration work is nearly complete.

Adult Education, which currently operates out of aging satellite buildings at the Mt. Blue High School Campus has received a grant that would cover the cost to purchase the former Ingall's School in Farmington. The district would likely be able to cover operating costs by renting out office space and, according to the terms of the grant, providing rooms to the hospital for telemedicine providing access to healthcare specialists to local residents. This unique opportunity will likely come to a district wide vote this spring.
